<b>Lead in Air</b>					
			Are there air monitors in your area for known lead issues?		
			Is your area a nonattainment zone (areas in the U.S. where air pollution levels have not met the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for criteria air pollutants) for lead?		

			Are there lead-emitting facilities in your area?		
<b>Lead in Child-Occupied Facilities</b>					
			Are you aware of the percentage of children's schools in the area that were built before 1978?		
			In your area, are there lead pipes or lead service lines in child-occupied facilities?		
			Among the child-occupied facilities in your area, are there drinking water reports or testing for lead?		
			Have lead inspection or risk assessment reports identified lead in the child-occupied facilities in your area?		
<b>Cultural Practices, Occupations, &amp; Hobbies</b>					
			As part of community members' cultural practices, do they use items that may contain lead? This may include the use of imported goods, including candy, spices, ceremonial powders, folk remedies, or traditional medicines.		
			Do community members participate in jobs or hobbies that may expose them to lead? This may include working with lead and/or lead-based paint, hunting, fishing, making pottery, etc.
